Rob E Foti, Mgr-Northeast refining-Optimization, Strategic Planning & Performance Analysis for Sunoco Refining & Supply, Inc will be the speaker at our April 19th, 2007 monthly meeting Rob's talk would address the nature of alternative fuels (particularly, transport fuels) from the perspective of a petroleum refining Company. He has 28 years experience principally in oil refinery production planning and economics. In addition, He has held commercial trading and supply positions for Sunoco, Inc. in both crude oil and natural gas. In his current position, Rob has responsibility to develop a long term capital and production plan for the Northeast facilities spanning 10 years, as well as manage the day-to-day oil flow aspects of those facilities. Rob has a BS Chemical Engineering from Drexel University.

This meeting will be held at Galdo's Catering, located at 20th & Moyamensing Ave, Phila. Pa.

Following the meeting & lunch, an optional tour of Sunoco's largest refinery in South Philadelphia will be conducted.

It is IMPERATIVE that anyone wishing to attend the tour, MUST pre-register in advance, and also must have picture ID with them on the day of the meeting. Anyone NOT pre-registered will probably not be permitted on the refinery tour.

*Via I-76 (Schuylkill Expressway)**

1. Follow I-76 East to **Exit 347A – Penrose Ave. - Int'l Airport.**
2. At the next traffic light turn left onto Penrose Ave.
3. Proceed on Penrose to the second traffic light – 20th Street. There is a highway overpass above the intersection.
4. Make a left onto 20th St. Galdo's Catering is on your right as you drive under the highway overpass (the tan brick building).

*Via I-95 North**

1. Take **Exit 13** (just past PHL International Airport). Follow signs to **I-76 via 291 – Valley Forge.**
2. You will cross the Geo. Platt Bridge over the Schuylkill River. The Sunoco Philadelphia refinery will be on your left. There is a traffic light at the bottom of the bridge. (count this as number 1)
3. Proceed straight at the bottom of the bridge – do not follow the signs to I-76. You are now on Penrose Ave.
4. Proceed to the third traffic light (20th St.). There will be a highway overpass above the intersection.
5. Turn left onto 20th Street. Galdo's will be immediately on your right after you make the turn – immediately after you pass under the highway overpass.

Via I-95 South

1. Take Exit - Broad St – 611. (Lincoln Financial Field will be on your right – home of the Philadelphia Eagles)
2. Bear right at the bottom of the ramp onto Broad St. northbound.
3. Move into the left lane – be careful of traffic emerging from I-95N on your left.
4. Just past Zinkoff Blvd. move left onto the feeder street marked "W. B. Pattison Ave. (for westbound Pattison Ave.)
5. Turn right on 20th St. to the next light. There is a highway overpass above the intersection. Galdo's is located straight across the intersection on your right just past the overpass.

ENERGY NEWS:

MARYLAND

PSC's new chairman said that he is committed to re-examining electricity regulation and said the commission will look closely at the possibility of a deferral plan for BGE ratepayers who are likely to see steep increases in their utility bills this summer.

Pepco Energy Services, a subsidiary of Pepco Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: POM) and a leader in energy savings performance contracting, has been selected to execute a comprehensive energy efficiency and guaranteed savings program for the Southwestern Virginia Training Center (SWVTC), located in Hillsville, Virginia.

PENNSYLVANIA

One out of six Peco customers is behind in paying energy bills, up sharply from last year, the company said and shutoffs could begin for some of those customers.

PPL Corporation announced that David G. DeCampli has been named president of PPL Electric Utilities, its Pennsylvania electricity delivery company.

Business customers have rated Allegheny Power, the electric delivery subsidiary of Allegheny Energy, Inc. (as one of the top performers in customer satisfaction among electric utilities in the eastern United States.

PECO Energy Co. has become the first electric utility in Pennsylvania to move to comply with a state law that requires increasing amounts of alternative energy be used to generate electricity supplied to customers after 2010.

PECO took the first steps in fulfilling the ambitious Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards (AEPS) requirements enacted in 2004, through a petition filed today with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PA PUC).

NEW JERSEY

The Shaw Group Inc. announced that it has been awarded an engineering, procurement and construction (EPC) contract by PSEG Fossil LLC, a subsidiary of Public Service Enterprise Group Inc. (NYSE: PEG), to install mercury control and flue gas desulfurization (FGD) systems for Units 1 and 2 at PSEG's Mercer Generating Station near Trenton, New Jersey.

NEW YORK

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (Con Edison) has invested \$1.4 billion in its electric delivery infrastructure preparing for this summer, and has established several new emergency response and communications programs, company officials told the New York City Council.
