**ENERGY NEWS:**

**PENNSYLVANIA**

Exelon Generation notified the Nuclear Regulatory Commission that the company will begin the application process for a combined construction and operating license that would allow for the possible construction of a new nuclear plant at an as-yet unnamed location in Texas.

PECO announced it has agreed to sell \$300 million of First Mortgage Bonds maturing on October 1, 2036 with a coupon of 5.95 percent. Fitch Ratings assigned an 'A' rating to PECO Energy Co.'s (PECO) new \$300 million 5.95% issue of First and Refunding Mortgage Bonds due Oct. 1, 2036. The Rating Outlook is Stable. Net proceeds will be used to refinance commercial paper and for other general corporate purposes

Public Utility Commission (PUC) initiated an investigation into cost-effective and reasonable efforts that natural gas and electric utilities can take to help consumers conserve energy or use it more efficiently.

PA commonwealth is making highway right-of-ways available for landfill gas pipeline projects, further encouraging and promoting the recovery and use of this emerging source of renewable energy.

Penn Future announced that it and 16 other parties had reached a settlement with Pittsburgh-based Duquesne Light Company that will, for the first time in this region, provide \$6 million over four years for renewable energy development and conservation programs.

**NEW JERSEY**

PSEG announced the election of Ralph Izzo as president and chief operating officer of the company and also as a member of the Board of Directors.

A Cabinet-level committee will meet in Trenton on October 3rd to start developing a new energy master plan for New Jersey. The kickoff meeting for the heads of nine departments and agencies was announced Monday by Jeanne Fox, president of the Board of Public Utilities.

PSEG and Exelon Corporation announced Exelon has given PSEG formal notice of termination of the merger agreement announced December 20, 2004, and the companies have agreed to withdraw their application for merger approval, which has been pending before the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBP) for more than 19 months.

**NEW YORK**

New York State Public Service Commission voted to approve a two-year rate plan for Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc.'s (Con Edison) steam service that will maintain base rates at current levels through September 30, 2008.

**MARYLAND**

Legislation aimed at lowering electric rates for 1.1 million Maryland consumers starting next year may face a court challenge if the proposed merger by Constellation Energy Group and a Florida utility owner falls apart amid regulatory delays, legal experts say. A top executive of Juno Beach-based FPL Group Inc. gave a dim view of prospects for his company's proposed merger with Constellation Energy Group of Baltimore, saying "It's not good for either of our companies, or for shareholders, for this thing to drag on indefinitely."

**VIRGINIA**

Sharply rising electric rates in Maryland and Delaware have Virginians, including state lawmakers, wondering what will happen when capped rates end here in four years.

**CALIFORNIA**

CA FERC unanimously paved the way for California to move into a new electricity era -- one that restores confidence in energy markets and lays the groundwork for meeting California's growing power needs.

**FERC**

Large Public Power Council (LPPC) filed comments with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) that were sharply critical of several industry advocates urging FERC to "revisit" mandatory RTO participation and the Standard Market Design (SMD) proposals abandoned by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission last year.

ITC Holdings Corp announced that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") approved a joint application made by ITC Holdings, ITC Transmission, Michigan Transco Holdings, Limited Partnership and Michigan Electric Transmission Company, LLC ("METC") to acquire all of the outstanding equity interests in METC, a privately-held company and the neighboring transmission system to ITC Transmission in a transaction valued at approximately \$867 million.
